REACH Conference FAQs

Does my student have to stay in a Host Home?

Host home participation is not required to be a part of the weekend. We certainly encourage every student to stay in a host home with their group because of the fellowship and discipleship that happens in the home. But it is not required. If a student does not want to stay in a host home they can be picked up at the end of each Evening session and then rejoin their group in the mornings either at the host home, or at church.

Does my student need money for the weekend?

No. All meals and expenses are included in the price for the weekend. A student will not need any extra money.

What if my student has work, practice, game, etc. during the weekend?

Not a problem! During check-in on Friday, parents can fill out a "sign out form" letting us know when a student will be leaving the Conference and when they estimate they will return.

Can my student request to be in a certain group?

Groups are based on age and gender and to keep groups smaller, some ages may be split. We will do our best to make sure your student is with some of their friends when building the groups. Those who are invited guests of regular Providence attenders, can let us know who you are coming with so we can try to pair them with the friend who invited them.

Can Parents help with the weekend?

Sure! There are many volunteer roles that need to be filled in order to make REACH Conference successful. You can check out the "Volunteer Opportunities" heading on the REACH website.

What if my student has special dietary needs/allergies?

Not a problem. On the registration form, there is a place you can share about those needs, and we will do everything in our power to make sure your student is safe and has what they need.
